

Architectural Competition soon settled This weekend is the last chance for the public to see and submit votes on the architect's proposal which is displayed at Källörsskolan in Östhammar. Over 30 proposals on how Källörsområdet might look like in the future are on display in Källörsskolans old classrooms. Many Östhammarsbor have already submitted their comments in the suggestion box that is located inside the entrance. - It has been quite a lot of votes. Some people have talked about what options they think is bad too, but we are less interested, says city architect Ingmar Lönngren. How the public's reaction to the different architectural proposals in the competition, European 10 is not crucial to what can actually be built on the site at Östhammar bay. An international jury will begin in October to examine the proposals and it is the jury which designates winners on 18 January. What then is built up by the municipality and potential developers, in consultation with one or more architects. - The jury is of course interested in the proposal designated as the winner also can be realized, so it will probably be pretty much listen to our views, "says Ingmar Lönngren. According to Ingmar Lönngren go twenty proposals removed immediately. Some have not taken into account the municipality's requirement that the promenade should be preserved, and others have not reported the hotel, meeting rooms, restaurant and SPA to be included in the complex. Still others are pure fantasy, which is unsuited to the city's character. - A hotel, for example, four floors are not suited to the city scale. Comments by the public, and Building Committee, will be published in connection with the winners chosen by the jury. In connection with that Ingmar Lönngren to a seminar with the winning architects can be held in Östhammar. - Hopefully, it will also be players who want to build, there are a handful of legitimate stakeholders what I know. The municipality will not be running and owning a hotel and it's likely that we sell the land as well.
